Youth Enrichment Programs

Through its global classroom, One World supplements traditional education with student-centered, competency-based learning to improve the -Communication, Collaboration, Creativity and Critical-thinking – skills critical for future success in an increasingly globalized world.



Now Over 200 Youth Clubs!

The One World Youth Club is a 25-week program that promotes the ideals and practices of global education, character education and service learning. One World provides curriculum guidebooks, Club advisor training, on-going customized program support and access to our One World global community. Students finish our program recognizing that they are globally competent, positive actors for change in an increasingly interconnected world.

Countries: Argentina, Venezuela, China, Ethiopia, Kyrgyzstan, Mexico, Nigeria, Uganda, United States, Wales Our Financial and Technology Readiness programs were launched in 2019. Our financial readiness program which was launched in Harlem in coordination with the NYPD Explorers Program includes financial literacy, entrepreneurship and stock market skills. All of our teams placed in the top one third of the statewide stock market contest with one team placing in the top 1%. Our goal is to bring financial competence to students in Harlem and the rest of the world. Our technology readiness programs prepare students for a world of exponential technological change. All of our programs make full use of our global learning community – our 21st century school - to discuss our human connections, the global economy, and the impact technology change has on our lives with a view to generating a global conversation that leads to a better understanding of our complex world and hopefully to values-based global solutions.



Taking One World School-Wide

Working closely with Harvard Professor Fernando Reimers our school-wide program has been rolled out to 20 schools impacting 10,000 students. Our professional development team works directly with educational leadership teams and teachers to embed global competence into the existing curriculum across all disciplines. A pathway to global competence certification for schools is also available.

Sustainable Impact Programs

One World delivers lessons, activities and service learning programs that support and promote the United Nations 17 sustainable development goals; that address critical issues of world peace, hunger, poverty, equality, clean oceans and the environment.

Carbon Neutral Program

In collaboration with One World and the UN, the Port Chester School District is pleased to be the first school district in the US to become carbon neutral as part of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) secretariat's Climate Neutral Now initiative. Kids learned to measure their school and district carbon footprint and find ways to offset it.

Resource Responsibility

When it comes to preserving the environment, the simple and small changes implemented into daily family life can have a big impact on the world around us. One Worlders conducted over 20,000 "*Eco-Acts*" this year, including: Using reusable bags, recycling, powering down devices, walking or biking, reducing water usage, switching to e-statements from junk mail and stopping bottled water purchase. One World students are also participating in the Westchester County Youth Summit on Climate Action.

World Oceans Day 2019

June 8th is World Oceans Day, the United Nations' day for celebrating the role of the oceans in our everyday lives and inspiring action to protect the ocean and to sustain marine resources. One World was pleased to send student representatives to participate in learning and educational forums on the Peace Boat in New York City.

One World Wins China's Sycamore Award

Named after the tree that represents the City of Nanjing, One World won the Sycamore award, in recognition of its role and work in enhancing mutual understanding and friendship between China and the rest of the world, in an effort to create an environment conducive to China's and the world's peaceful development. Nanjing, the former capital of China is an International City of Peace.

February: One World Week 2019

One World was thrilled to host over 100 administrators and educators from around the world for a customized Harvard Think Tank on global competence presented by Dr. Fernando Reimers, a Harvard professor and world-renowned leader on this topic. The professional development sessions featured lectures, work groups, self-assessments and the development of school action plans.

April: A One World Celebration in China

In Nanjing, China 32 educators from Wales, the U.S. and Mexico joined over 500 educators and parents for our China conference and year-end celebration. We were thrilled that our host, Jinling Primary School, was recognized thanks to our joint efforts as the first school in China to be recognized as national school of character.

July: International Conference on Global

Education In Wales, One World participated in an International Conference for excellence in education in global competence, joining nearly 100 educators.

November: Practitioner Workshop

75 administrators and educators came together in New York to share best practices and their school-wide global competence action plans. We also strove to coordinate global programs on social-emotional learning, sustainable impact programs, and the expansion of our global community or our 21st century school.
