



Elementary School Delivery: Global Competence



GOAL: Graduate Global Citizens by End of Elementary

3rd grade *Communities Around the World* is a perfect starting point, and then progressively building global competence through 4th and 5th Grades.

We encourage to take 4-30 out of 900 yearly classroom hours to deliver Global Competence programs, either direct into your elementary school classrooms or as after school clubs.




Middle School Delivery: Introduce Future Ready School-wide

Full Year Program


We believe that the best way to introduce Middle School educators and students to our future ready programs is to adopt a full year program schoolwide (6, 7, and 8th grade).

Schools receive a customized scope and lesson sequence for the entire school year including introduction to our Future-Ready Competencies with one or two hours per week of instruction with a scaffolded progressive delivery of content.





Middle School Programs





GOAL: Graduate Emerging Future-Ready Leaders of Character by 8th Grade

The following skills are delivered as a year-long elective course which meets from 1-2 hours a week and exposes your students to the full spectrum of our future ready programs. This program would be offered in 6^{th} , 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade on a sequenced basis. *Modified delivery available

1) **Global Competence:** Students dive deeper into 21st-century skills such as growth mindset, character, creativity, collaboration, critical thinking, and continuous learning. Includes Virtual Exchange.

High School Delivery on a Customized basis
